Step 1: Eligibility Call and Consent Form

Step 3: EI

 - Usual time: **45 minutes-1 hour**, depending on your typical session length
- A staff member will also record you and your child playing for 10 minutes after each recorded EI visit

Activity Descriptions

- Surveys – questions about your child’s behaviors as well as your stress and motivation as a parent
- Preparation for your visit - Prior to your assessment/play-based activities, a staff member will drop off technology equipment and toys to your home. You will be invited to join a Zoom call with a staff member who will explain how to turn the cameras on and where to put the cameras so that we can observe your child’s behavior during the play-based activities
- Assessment - A staff member will guide you over Zoom through several play-based activities with your child using toys we provide. We like to think of the assessments as “plays”, and there will be different scenes that you will perform with your child.
- Interview - A member of our study team will ask you questions about your child’s daily activities and behaviors and about the services your child has received in the previous month
- LENA – This is a recording device that measures your child’s language environment.
